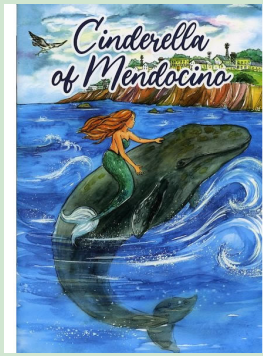

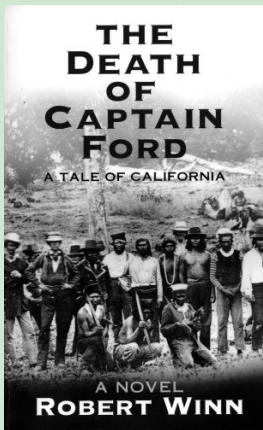

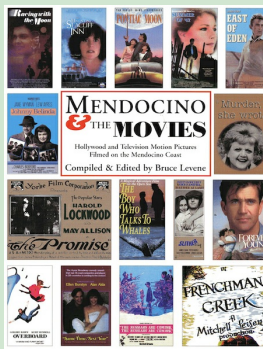


For Lovers of Historical Fiction

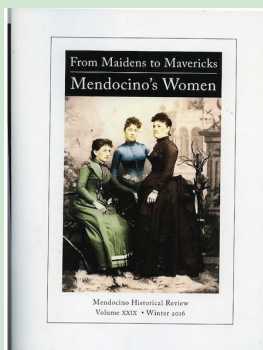

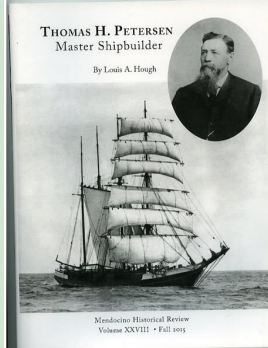

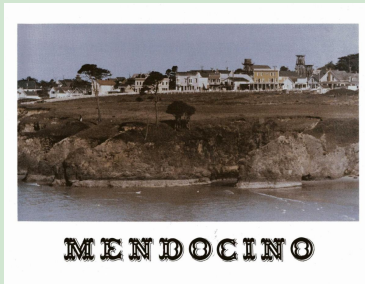
For Sailors and Builders

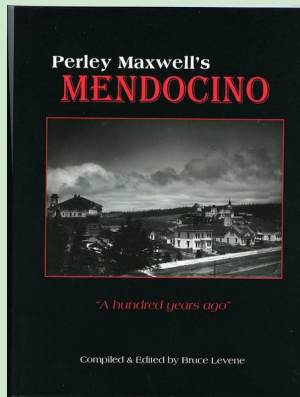
For Newcomers to Mendocino

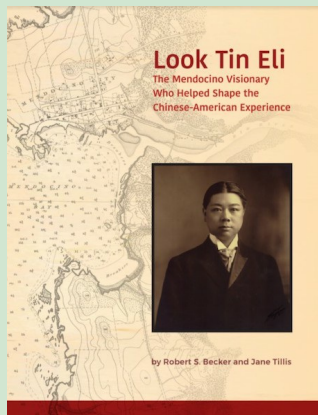
For Photography Lovers

For Students of Mendocino's Chinese History

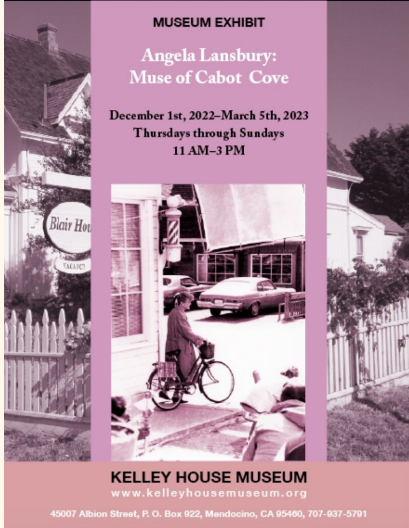
Look Tin Eli, *Temple of Kwan Tai*, and *Chinese in Mendocino County*
