
CAT MOTHER: Mendocino Coast Music


The Kelley House will continue to lead live tours regularly (check our web site for the current schedule), but the new self-guided tours give you a chance to learn much of this information at your own pace and on your own time.



What tours are on the App? You'll find "A Taste of Mendocino," a free tour that gives you a broad overview of Mendocino's history in four stops, along with recommended food to try along your route. Our signature tour, "Mendocino's Historic Main Street," costs \$9.99 and features 18 stops. It covers Mendocino's first indigenous residents, the logging years, the architecture and stories of the people who lived here at the turn of the 19th century, and the 20th century artists who helped preserve the town you see today. Visitors to Mendocino are most curious about our water towers, cemeteries, and the movies filmed here so we are adding specialty tours on these subjects. On the "Water Tower Tour" (\$9.99) you'll visit 15 remaining water towers and discover the fascinating history of these feats of engineering.


A PEEK INTO THE PAST

Jughandle Creek Trestle

The Jughandle Creek trestle was completed early in 1884, under the direction of engineers and bridge builders from the Central Pacific Railroad. This huge wooden trestle was 1,000 feet long,



146 feet high, 82 feet wide at the base, and 12 feet wide at the top. At the time, it was one of the largest and tallest structures of its kind. The earthquake of 1906 caused the trestle to "collapse like a row of dominoes" but it was quickly rebuilt closely following the original specifications. **Click Here** to see a photo of the collapsed bridge and to read more.



MELODY'S COOKIES

Our most popular blog post last month really hit readers in their sweet spot: "Melody's Cookies opened in 1973 on Lansing Street across from Mendosa's grocery store. Owner Melody Joy sold giant ginger, peanut butter, chocolate chip, and oatmeal raisin cookies. The cookie shop's little building was constructed in the 1960s as the office of McDonell's lumber yard. The Mendocino Beacon predicted that Melody's Cookies 'should become a popular shop for snackers.'

The cookies were enjoyed by both locals and tourists. In 1975, actor Clint Eastwood stayed at Little River Inn and toured Mendocino. 'He graciously signed his autograph for many teenagers, also stopping for one of Melody's giant cookies and signing her guest book adding 'super' for his cookies."
